





## 04 | Entry Details

#### 05 | Restriction on Pilot Age

The minimum age limit for participation in the UIM V2 Class is eighteen (18) years old on the day before the event begins.

# 06 | Registration

Registration will take place on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> September at the times indicated on the event schedule at section 03, above. Even where records are already held by Voomquest, it is advisable that each Pilot produces at Race Registration a copy of their National Authority Racing Licence, a medical certificate signed by a doctor per the form provided by Voomquest and an approved certificate indicating that they have successfully passed the immersion test. All certificates need to be valid for the 2019 season as indicated under the UIM V2 Class Rules.

# 07 | Prizes

VOOMQUEST will provide medals for the Podium 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>& 3<sup>rd</sup> placed in each of the 3 Races. Grand Prix Trophies will be awarded at the final event Podium for the top 3 points scorers of the overall Grand Prix.

## 08 | Insurance & Competitors Waiver

- 08.1 In order to participate all competitors and team members shall agree to waive any and all liability claims against the entire UIM and against the entire Event Organisation and their staff, sponsors, partners, agents, personnel contractors and those of the host venue and hotel. For the avoidance of any doubt this means a waiver of any rights to claims against any parties, individually or corporately.
- 08.2 All competitors and team members shall be insured and their boats insured against any claims for damage to other persons and boats (Third Parties) to a level that is appropriate to their individual personal circumstances and responsibilities.
- 08.3 For all crew mandatory insurance coverage must be purchased through the Event Organiser at a cost of €300 per boat, to be paid in cash to the Race Secretary during Race Registration. This insurance covers civil liability against third parties during all official testing and race times as per the official programme. For the avoidance of any doubt the insurance will not cover any on water or on land activities outside official event time.

### 09 | Fuel

VOOMQUEST's Fuel Partner, ENEMED, will provide the same supply of 98 Octane Unleaded Fuel to all V2 participants for purchase on the event at the market rate. The location of the fuel station is per the plan shown in section 20, "Venue Layout". Fuel may not be stored in cans within the team paddocks unless with the prior permission of the Race Director.

## 10 | Support Activities

- 10.1 **VOOMQUEST V2 Boat Parade** date and time per programme, above All the competing Teams will tour with their boats from the Chaudron Factory to the venue location. The Parade will make brief stops en-route to meet the public and give them the opportunity to see the boats ahead of the race weekend. For Teams planning merchandise or giveaways the Parade will be a chance to engage and garner fans for the season.
- 10.2 **VOOMQUEST V2 Welcome Reception** the event organizer will host a welcome reception for the Teams at the venue, date and time as advised on the programme, above.

## 11 | Local Rules

Full Race Instructions will be provided to the Teams in the week of the Event.

## 15 | The Race Course

#### 15.1 Design

The Race Course for the UIM V2 Powerboat Marfa, Malta, Grand Prix will be run in an anti-clockwise direction and will be organized as shown in the diagrams at Section 17, below. Key positions and turn marks will be indicated as follows:

Start Area / Chute (Start Boat, Flags)
Finish Line (Chequered Marks)
Port-side Marks (Yellow Marks)
Starboard-side Marks (Red Marks)

#### 15.2 In / Out Procedure

The in / out procedure that race boats will follow when entering or leaving the Race Course will be detailed in the Drivers' Briefing / Race Instructions

## 16 | Pole Position

Pole Position will be run on the same Race Course as for the three races. At the indicated time all boats shall be ready at the Wet Pits and follow the Start Boat to the Pole Position muster area.

More details on the Pole Position procedure will be provided in the Drivers' Briefing / Race Instructions.


# 17 | Testing and Race Course Layout

A plan of the testing, pole-position and race course is shown below.

The course marks are **A/A1** (chequered), **B** (yellow), **C** (yellow), **D** (red), **E** (yellow), **F** (yellow) and **G** (yellow).

Red marks V, W, X and Y form a safety buffer zone around the circuit. The area within these marks is restricted by Notice to Mariners to authorized event boats only.

Red marks I and J are "In / Out" procedure marks.



#### 21 | Special Notes

#### 21.01 Environmental Rule

Participants within V2 events are reminded to take all necessary measures to minimize any adverse impact of the sport on the environment. Team managers are responsible for ensuring that all members observe this rule including by ensuring that the area around each team paddock is free from waste, including plastic bottles and the like, which are to be disposed of in the appropriate containers. Any fuel spills are to be immediately reported to Pit Officials.

#### 21.02 No Smoking Areas

Technical Areas (Team Paddocks, Dry Pit, Wet Pit, Crane Area, Fuel Area) as well as all tents and temporary structures are strictly designated as "No Smoking" areas.

#### 21.03 Craning and Boat Movements

Team managers are responsible for ensuring that no team members are on the boats when these are being craned. Similarly, no team members will ride on the boat, its trailer or hang off the towing vehicle during boat movements between the Dry Pit and Crane Area. Team members will instead walk alongside the front and rear side of the boat, on opposite sides, to monitor against the risk of accidental impact between the trailer and any person.

#### 21.04 Accreditation

All Team Managers are reminded that in the interests of safety and security technical areas are reserved for authorized event pass holders over the age of 16 years. Passes that are issued to team members may not be transferred to third parties. Teams are responsible for applying with the organizers for accreditation for any person that may be eligible in advance of the event. Any person associated with a team that uses abusive language, aggressive behaviour or any form of force in order to try and access the venue without the proper accreditation will lead to disciplinary action being taken against the relevant team.

Teams are being reminded that in case of breaching of rules, including those mentioned in 21.01 to 21.04 above, the Race Director will take any action deemed suitable including application of fines, yellow cards and / or disqualification.
