FINAL RANKINGS OF TOP UIM CLASSES TO BE DECIDED IN THE UNITED ARAB EMIRATES

The final rounds of the main UIM classes will be held in the United Arab Emirates these days with the 2019 UIM World Champions in UIM F1H2O, UIM F2, UIM XCAT and 4 categories of the UIM-ABP Aquabike discipline to be crowned between December 7th and 21st.

This weekend will see the last round of the UIM F2 World Championship held in Abu Dhabi where local driver Rashed Al Qemzi (UAE) of Team Abu Dhabi is the clear favourite with an advantage of 27 points over Duarte Benavente (POR) in second place.

Speaking about the UIM Offshore XCAT World Championship (December 12-14) to be held in Dubai, the favourite Team is Dubai Police who currently hold first place in the championship, with the gap to second and third ranked Teams amounting to just seven and eight points respectively (pending the outcome of an Appeal procedure currently in progress).

This situation will ensure a very spectacular final phase of the UIM XCAT World Championship.

From December 17-21, the final round of the UIM-ABP Aquabike World Championship and the UIM F1H2O World Championship will be held in Sharjah.

In Aquabike, Andrzej Wisniewski (POL) is in prime position in Runabout GP1 but Yousef Al-Abdulrazzaq (KUW) and Rashed Al Tayer (UAE) are just seven points adrift. In the two Ski division disciplines, Kevin Reiterer (AUT) and Emma-Nellie Ortendahl (SWE) have secured their world titles by creating a huge gap over the second position, while Rashid Al Mulla (UAE) is the favourite in the Freestyle disciplines with an 18-point gap over Roberto Mariani (ITA).

Elsewhere, Shaun Torrente (USA/UAE) leads the UIM F1H2O World Championship by just five points from Jonas Andersson (SWE), which guarantees a nail-biting finish to the championship series

The UIM XCAT World Championship went to China for the Grand Prix of Shanghai, the second stage of the 2019 season with three races over four days on Dishui Lake.

In Race 3 Martimo took the advantage to make a double first podium over the Shanghai weekend followed by Abu Dhabi 5 and in the third place Abu-

Dhabi 4. (subject of the outcome to the appeal in progress).

The final round of the season will take place in Dubai in the United Arab Emirates on December 12-14 and announces two very spectacular races due to the minimal points' difference between the first 3 places in the overall Championship ranking.





92ND UIM GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN QINGDAO, CHINA

The 92nd UIM General Assembly was hosted this year by the China Water Sports Administration (CWSA) and welcomed over 140 UIM delegates who had travelled from more than 40 countries to attend this institutional summit in Qingdao, China.

One of the outstanding points on the agenda were the Presidential elections, where Dr. Raffaele Chiulli was re-elected UIM President for another four years term. "This re-election rewards the strong willingness I have always expressed over these years, to renew and to rejuvenate the Powerboat Sport," said Dr. Chiulli after his re-election.

As for the elections for the Council, Commission and Committee members you will find below a summary of what happened during the General Assembly:

- Mr. Davor Hundic (CRO) appointed as co-opted member for Aquabike activities within the Youth Development Committee
- Mr. Stefano Somigli (ITA) appointed as co-opted member for Aquabike activities within the Youth Development Committee
- Mr. Alejo Sotelo (ARG) appointed Expert Hydrofly within the Aquabike Committee
- Mr. Miguel Valente (POR) appointed Vice-Chairman of the Aquabike Committee
- Mr. Luo Bing (CHN) appointed Expert within the Aquabike Committee
